Does your Wi-Fi seem slow at times?

Wi-Fi stands for "wireless fidelity." In everyday terms, Wi-Fi is the wireless signal between your router and any wireless devices you are using. Wi-Fi is a radio transmission technology that allows high speed and secure communications between a wide variety of devices, and hardware. Wi-Fi is exceedingly important for the way we operate our modern connected world. It transmits information at specific frequencies, most typically at 2.4GHz and 5GHz.

There are many devices that can cause Wi-Fi "interference." As new Wi-Fi devices are put into use on a subscriber's network, we are seeing more and more interference of the overall Wi-Fi experience.

The most common devices known to potentially cause performance issues are:

- *Sound bars *Baby monitors
- *Large mirrors
- *Roku televisions

- *HP wireless printers
- *Sonos wireless speakers
- *DirecTV set top boxes

- *Canon wireless printers
- *ADT security systems
- *2.4 or 5.8 cordless phones

Most of these devices use wireless frequencies that can consume or interfere with your Wi-Fi. If you have any of these devices and are experiencing slower Wi-Fi, try removing the power from the device(s), retest your Wi-Fi to determine if this device(s) could be causing your issue. Also remember when testing your internet speed to use a wired device. Wireless devices do not provide an accurate result.

Our world is going Wi-Fi. Every day it seems like some new appliance, equipment or electronic is Wi-Fi capable. When we think about what devices we have consuming our bandwidth, we tend to think about computers, smartphones, tvs, and gaming devices. However, in addition to hundreds of Wi-Fi capable electronics, you can purchase almost any type of appliance with smart home Wi-Fi capabilities. Let's also don't forget about security cameras, doorbells, printers, clocks, digital radios, and even cars.
