### **FUSC Percentage Changes:**

The FCC released a public notice increasing the Federal Universal Service Contribution Factor (FUSC) for single line and multi line businesses from 27.1% to 31.8% for the first quarter of 2021. This will not affect residential line customers. We are required to bill customers this new rate beginning January 1, 2021. This is the charge that we all pay to help keep phone service affordable throughout the nation, especially in rural areas such as ours. This percentage fluctuates quarterly.

years. Although the nominees as candidates are selected by these committees, the by-laws also allow for any other certified member of these exchanges the same right in running and serving a three year term as Director for their exchange. If you are interested, you can pick up a petition (required to be signed by 10% or 15 certified members, whichever is less, of your exchange) at the co-op from the General Manager, along with the specific details and requirements of serving as a Director.

You will have until March 15 to file your certified petition with the Co-op for your name to be placed on the ballot at the annual meeting. If you are not the nominee selected by the committee and would like your name printed in the annual meeting booklet, you will need to file your petition by February 15th due to the printing lead time requirements.

We look forward to seeing you at the Annual Meeting in 2021.
