Board of Director Announcement:

Although we are still uncertain about the timing of our Annual Meeting, we will still be taking the normal steps for the board elections in hopes that our meeting can be held. This year Belle Prairie (648) and Macedonia (728) exchanges will be up for Director Elections.

The nominating committees for the 648 exchange nominated Alan Monroe and the 728 exchange nominated Chris Sink to serve another three year term on the HCTC Board. Although the nominees as candidates are selected by these committees, the by-laws also allow for any other certified member of these exchanges the same right in running and serving a three year term as Director for their exchange. In the News - FCC releases Rural Digital Opportunity Fund

You may have heard about the recent RDOF auction in the news. There are still millions of homes and small businesses lacking speeds of at least 25 Meg across our country including within our Co-op. The FCC recently released the Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) as another step in bridging the digital divide. These eligible areas are underserved and left behind by bigger carriers such as Frontier.

Since the reduction of support in 2016, your Co-op is constantly looking at funding opportunities to help and secure the survival of our Co-op for generations to come. The cost of deploying a fully fed fiber network is expensive and monetarily not sustainable at just one or two homes per mile. This alone makes rural areas like ours a business case failure. However, we do see light at the end of the tunnel. In the past two years, there have been new funding opportunities through the USDA and the State of Illinois that are working to serve the underserved, some of which we received for our co-op. We anticipate more funding opportunities over the next year or so as well. We are looking into any and all funding available to our area.

The RDOF is no exception. Your Co-op was able to secure funding in many areas of Hamilton County. This funding opportunity is allowing us to reach our neighbors plagued with low speeds less than 10/1 Mbps and unacceptable service. It is in the Co-ops best interest to pick up additional revenue to make up for the shortfall of the lost funds to expand in our Co-op area. Our long term goal is for the Co-op to be self-sufficient and self-supporting by 2028 as federal support dollars vanish.
